1918 Camp Knox established

1925 Designated as Camp Henry Knox National Forest

1932 Camp Knox renamed Fort Knox & serves as home of Mechanized Cavalry

1936 Bullion Depository constructed

1940 Armored Force established

1944 Fort Knox home to POW camp

1949 Patton Museum opens

1956 Fort Knox becomes home of the U.S. Army Training Center-Armor and begins its basic training mission

2005 Transforms from Home of Armor to a multifunctional, multi-command Army post due to Base Realignment and Closure decisions

2011 Largest single combat deployment since WWII

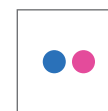
2011 Basic training mission relocated

The U.S. Bullion Depository at Fort Knox, which holds 147.3 million ounces of gold, is located adjacent to the Army post. No visitors are allowed.



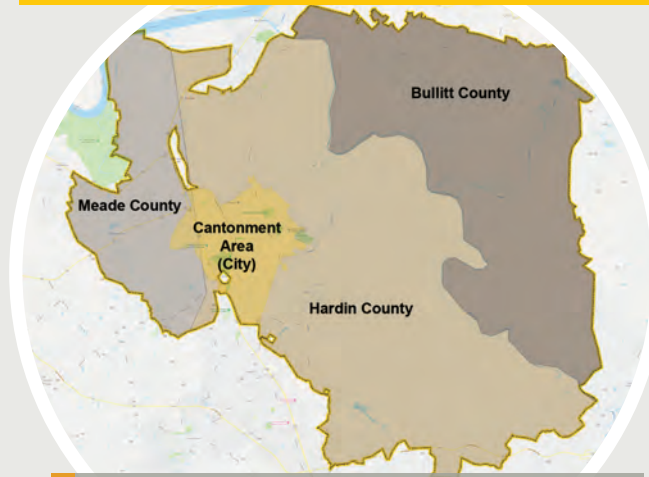
The General Patton Museum, established in May 1949, is home to the largest artifact collection of famed U.S. Army leader General George S. Patton Jr.

Fort Knox footprint encompasses portions of Bullitt, Hardin and Meade counties in Kentucky.



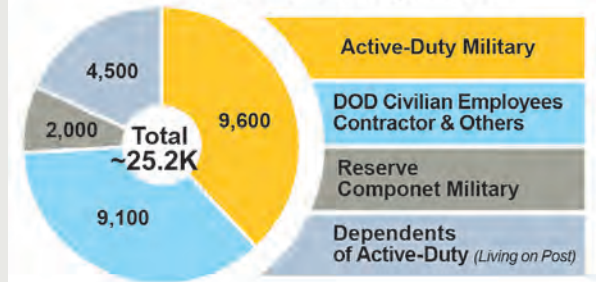

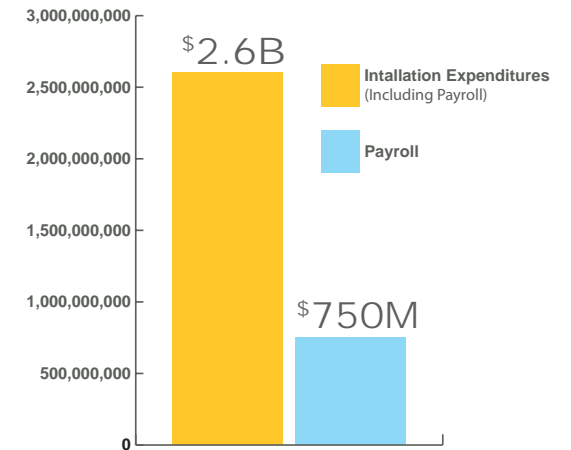
