Lincoln Trail Area Development District Releases Mission Knox Study Draft

Study aims to ensure regional collaboration and military sustainability

ELIZABETHTOWN, KY (October 4, 2021) – The Lincoln Trail Area Development District (LTADD) seeks public feedback on its DRAFT Compatible Use Plan (CUP) that aims to ensure local and regional sustainability between Fort Knox and its neighboring communities. The CUP process is a collaborative effort between the Fort Knox Military Installation, local and state governments, private citizens, and other interested stakeholders, which began in the fall of 2019.

The study area intersects several counties and municipalities in the region which include the counties of Bullitt, Hardin, Meade and Nelson. The study evaluates military issues that interfere with daily civilian life and evaluates new development that might hinder the missions of Fort Knox.

The Draft of the *Compatible Use Plan Study* is now available for review and comment. An online public survey is open during the month of October for all to provide input.
